This role underscored the importance of strategic vision and adaptability within a rapidly evolving sector.

Subsequently as Director at the Dutch Trade Unions (FNV), allowed me to directly engage in negotiations and advocacy for pension agreements and pensioners' interests. My current focus on implementing the 2023 Dutch new Pension Law and serving as chairman of BPL (industrywide pension fund) as employee representative. In these roles I continue to show my commitment to the welfare of pensioners and the integrity of the pension system.

My career is characterized by a steadfast dedication to innovation, negotiation, and collaboration to navigate and shape the complex landscape of pension policy.
